



**ASSISTANT PROFESSOR
DIVISION OF PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT STUDIES

West Virginia University located in Morgantown, WV, is seeking a full-time, non-tenure track (12-month) Assistant Professor for the Division of Physician Assistant Studies in the Department of Human Performance in the School of Medicine. The successful candidate will be a principal faculty member, and contribute to a well-established program with a tradition of excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service. The successful candidate will also serve as an academic advisor to students in the program and participate in the admissions process through screening, interviewing, and rating of applicants.

The program is administratively housed within the School of Medicine's Professional Programs unit, which is home to over 2,100 students enrolled in degree programs including exercise physiology, occupational therapy, physical therapy, athletic training, medical laboratory sciences, immunology, communication sciences and disorders, pathologists' assistant and health information management. The physician assistant program reports to the vice-dean for professional programs in the School of Medicine.

The Assistant Professor must meet the following criteria for consideration:

- Hold a master's degree in Physician Assistant Studies
- Must have a Physician Assistant license for West Virginia or be eligible for a West Virginia licensure
- Must hold current National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistant (NCCPA) certification
- Two years of experience in physician assistant education. Experience may be didactic and/or clinical in nature.

All qualifications must be met by the time of appointment
